The Dental Implant Process

1. Initial Consultation:

- X-rays or 3D scans to assess bone density and plan treatment.
- Discussion of your goals and treatment options.

2. Implant Placement Surgery:

- The titanium implant post is surgically placed into the jawbone.
- Local anaesthesia is used to ensure comfort during the procedure.

3. Healing and Osseointegration:

- Over 3 to 6 months, the implant fuses with the jawbone, a process known as Osseointegration.
- Temporary teeth may be provided during healing.

4. Abutment Placement:

- Once healing is complete, an abutment (connector) is attached to the implant post.

5. Restoration Placement:

- A custom-made crown, bridge, or denture is placed on the abutment to complete your smile.

Aftercare and Recovery

Proper aftercare is essential to ensure the success and longevity of your dental implants.

Post-Surgery Care:

- **Oral Hygiene:** Brush and floss regularly to keep the implant area clean.
- **Diet:** Stick to soft foods for the first few days after surgery.
- **Medication:** Follow prescribed medications for pain management and infection prevention.
- **Avoid Smoking:** Smoking can hinder the healing process.
